Mispronouncing diphthongs: Diphthongs are complex vowel sounds made up of two vowel sounds that glide smoothly together. Common examples include "oi" in "oil" and "ou" in "house." Mispronouncing diphthongs can lead to confusion and difficulty in understanding.

Using the wrong stress in multi-syllable words: English words often have different stress patterns, meaning that certain syllables are emphasized more than others. Misplacing stress in multi-syllable words can change the meaning of the word and make it sound unnatural.

Neglecting regional accent variations: English is spoken with various regional accents, each with its own unique pronunciation of vowels. Ignoring these variations can lead to misunderstandings and misinterpretations when communicating with native speakers of a particular region. It is important to be aware of and adapt to different accent variations in order to communicate effectively in English.
